The Brewhouse, Taunton is Somerset's largest theatre and arts venue. The building houses two gallery spaces, an auditorium with 352 seats, a workshop, a studio, a mezzanine space, a darkroom and a restaurant and bar area. The Brewhouse aims to promote excellence of the arts from a local to international level. We focus on theatre, film, visual arts and education. Past gallery exhibitions involving disability arts have included Art and Power's 'Dormitory Beds' (2003), Blind Alphabet C (2000), 'Unseen Bodies of Work', three disabled artists (2003).

Currently the Brewhouse is reassessing its purpose and objectives in creating Somerset's cultural future. The important questions we are asking ourselves at this time are –how can we develop as an organisation that nurtures and supports emerging local writers and visual artists?...find meaningful ways for the organisation, artists and community to interact?...make education and learning integral to what we do, and not a latch-on?

In 1946 the Wildfowl and Wetlands trust was founded at Slimbridge by the artist and naturalist, Sir Peter Scott.
